COMFLEACT YOKOSUKA INSTRUCTION 1710.67D

Subj: BASE FISHING REGULATIONS

Encl: (1) Authorized Fishing Map

1. Purpose. To update and issue fishing regulations for U.S. Fleet Activities (FLEACT) Yokosuka.
2. Cancellation. COMFLEACTINST 1710.67B. This instruction has been completely revised and should be read in its entirety.
3. Designated Fishing Areas onboard U.S. FLEACT Yokosuka. Fishing is only permitted per enclosure (1). Along the shoreline from Mikasa Park Gate (next to U.S. Naval Hospital (NAVHOSP) Yokosuka) to and alongside Ombudsman Bay.
4. Authorized Hours. Fishing is allowed 24-hours a day, seven days a week.
5. Sanitation and Health
 - a. Fish will not be gutted or otherwise cleaned while fishing in public or common areas.
 - b. Trash, debris, unused bait, etc. will not be thrown or otherwise deposited into the ocean and will be removed by the person fishing when he/she leaves.
6. Restrictions. An adult must accompany children under 13 years of age and remain with them at all times when they are fishing.
7. General Safety Precautions. The following safety precautions are required:
 - a. Wear protective eye wear when fishing.
 - b. Wear a hat with a brim to prevent potential injuries to the face or head.
 - c. Wear a personal floatation device, which must meet Coast Guard requirements. The label of all U.S. Coast Guard (USCG) approved life jackets contains a statement that it is approved, with an approval number. This guarantees that the life vest is approved by the USCG. There must be a USCG logo on the vest or floatation device, when fishing along shoreline not protected by a fence.

- d. Always know what is behind you when casting. Be aware of your surroundings. Do not allow people to stand or sit behind you, as you may hook them or hit them with a sinker.
- e. Stay on the landward side of any fence along the shore.
- f. Do not fish from shoreline not protected by a fence after sunset and during adverse weather.
- g. If you hook yourself, do not remove a fishhook by yourself if it is deeply imbedded or is hooked in a vital organ (such as an eye). Go to the NAVHOSP Yokosuka Emergency Room for treatment or call 243-7141/046-816-0911. Do not cut the hook off before seeking medical treatment.
- h. Personnel shall not enter the water during adverse weather, after dark, or our waist deep when fishing.

8. Action. All commands will ensure the requirements of this instruction are properly disseminated to their personnel FLEACT Yokosuka Security Department will enforce the requirements of this notification during the course of their normal patrol duties and report violation to the respective command for appropriate action.

9. Records Management. Records created as a result of this instruction, regardless of media or format, must be managed per Secretary of the Navy Manual 5210.1 of September 2019.

10. Review and Effective Date. Per OPNAVINST 5215.17A, FLEACT Yokosuka Fleet and Family Readiness Director will review this instruction annually on the anniversary of its effective date to ensure applicability, currency, and consistency with Federal, DoD, SECNAV, and Navy policy and statutory authority using OPNAV 5215/40 (Review of Instruction). This instruction will automatically expire ten years after effective date unless reissued or canceled prior to the anniversary date, or an extension has been granted.
