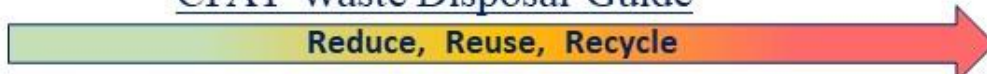

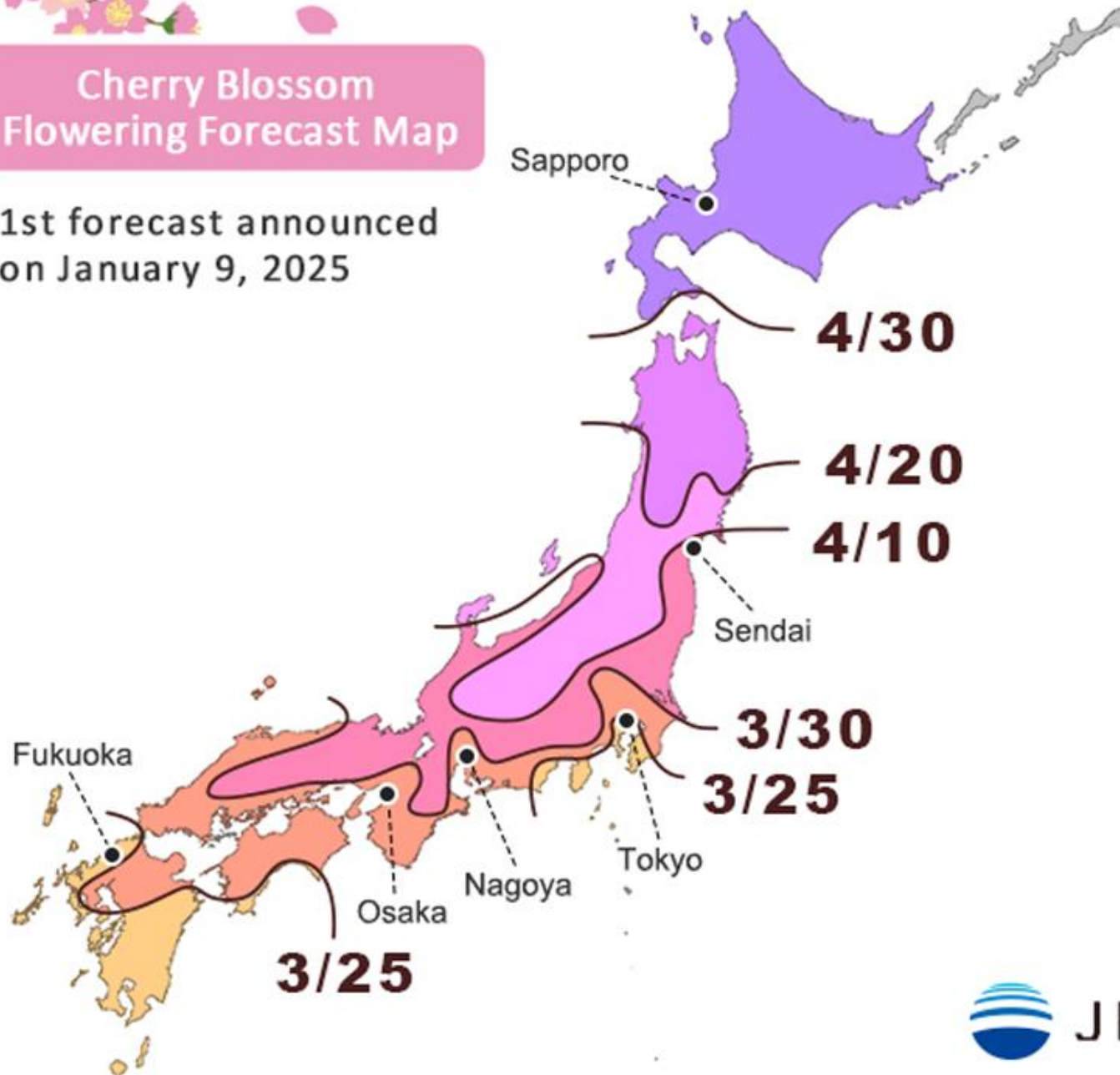

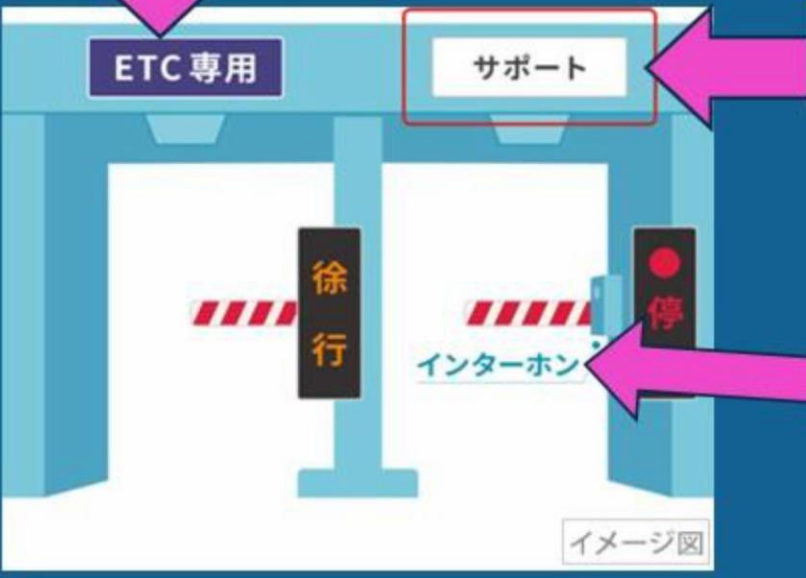
ETC-only toll gate **Drive Slowly**

PCS Guide – Leaving Japan with pets

Where are you going? :

U.S. **Non-continental U.S.** **Other country**

- Ensure pet's rabies vaccinations are up to date. Original copies of the certificates are required and need to be in English with the pet's microchip number.
- Complete U.S. import permit found on the CDC.GOV website or scan the QR code below. This step is for dogs only, cats do not have this extra step.



- Submit export notification to Animal Quarantine Services (AQS) to the airport you will be flying out of. Follow the QR code below. This is only for commercial flights, if flying AMC you will not need to do this step.



- Schedule Health Certificate appointment within 10 days of the flight.

GUAM (Start process 3 months in advance)

- Ensure pet is microchipped, has 2 rabies in lifetime (one must be current).
- Import permit (Owner must obtain this from Guam Dept. of Agriculture website).
- Guam affidavit (Our clinic can provide this document prior to the health certificate appointment if needed.
- If flying straight from Japan, FAVN is not required.
- Vaccines required for dogs: Rabies, DAPV, Leptospirosis, and Bordetella.
- Vaccines required for cats: Rabies and FVRCP.
- Dewormer and flea/tick medication will be administered day of health certificate appointment.
- Negative heartworm test
- Export notification to AQS and a health certificate within 10 days are required. See steps in box to the left.

HAWAII (Start process 3 months in advance)

- Ensure pet is microchipped, has 2 rabies in lifetime (one must be current).
- Import permit (Owner must obtain this from Hawaii Dept. of Agriculture website).
- FAVN with results of ≥ 0.5 (must be done 30 days before entering Hawaii).
- Dewormer and flea/tick medication will be administered day of health certificate appointment.
- Negative heartworm test
- Export notification to AQS and a health certificate within 10 days are required. See steps in box to the left.

The 60th Anniversary of the Selma to Montgomery Marches

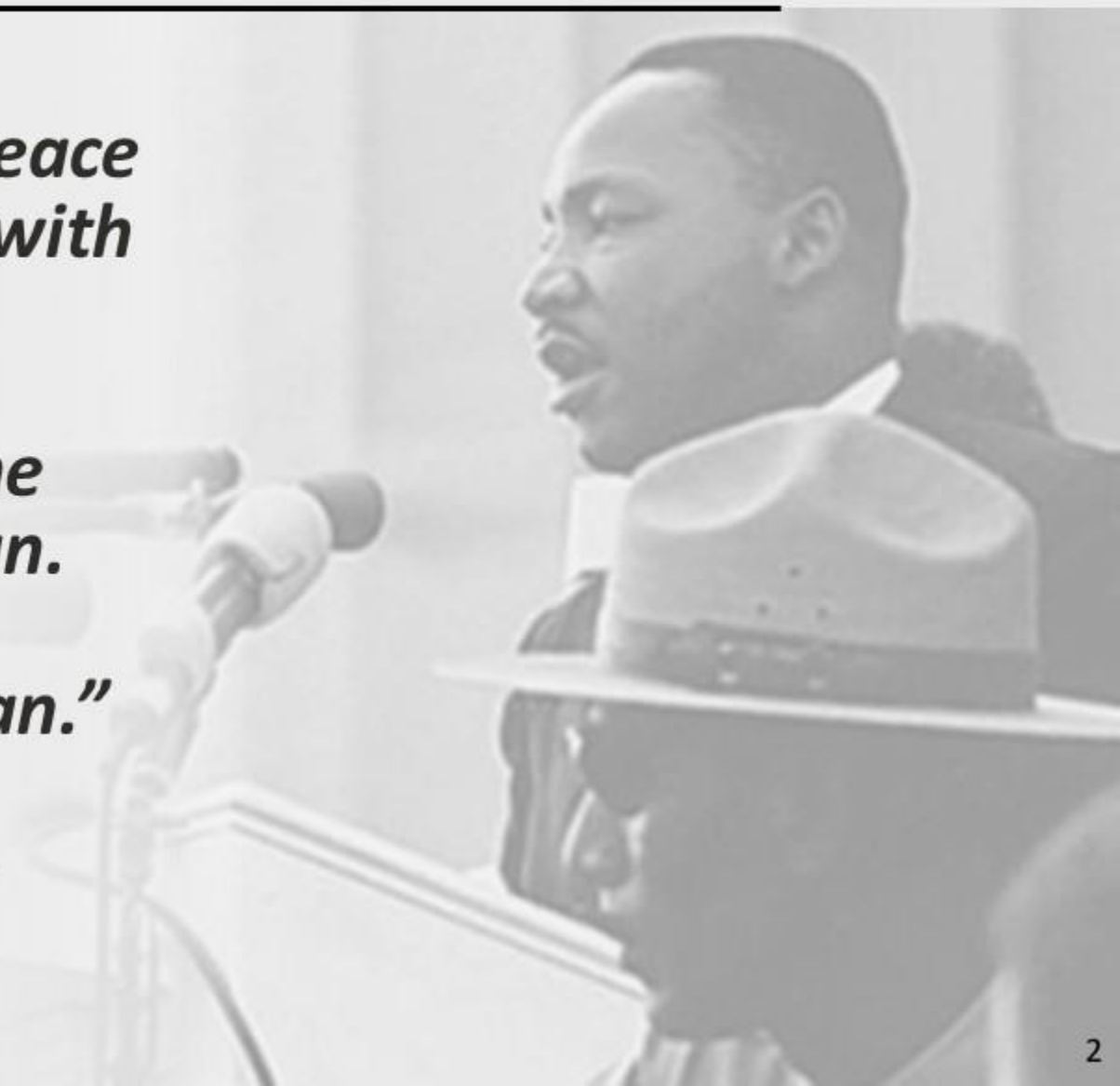

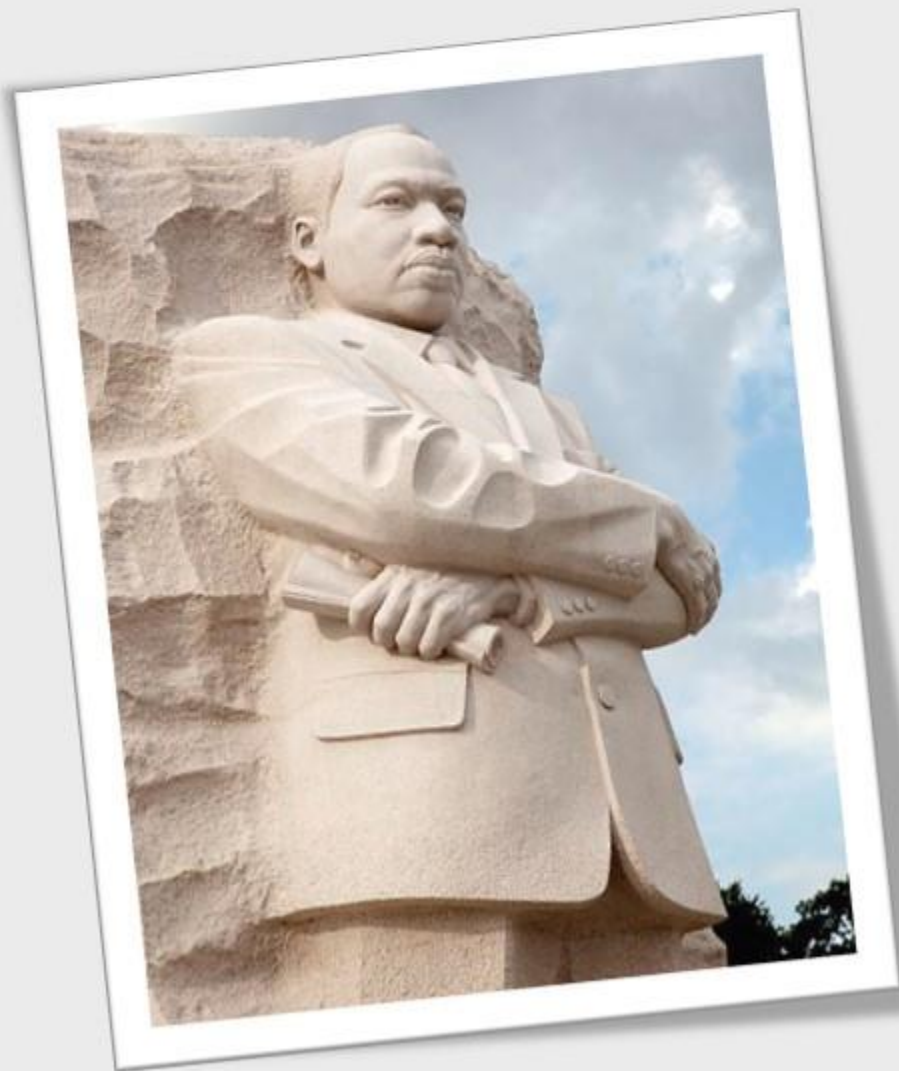

Martin Luther King, Jr., Day



Each year, the third Monday of January is celebrated as Martin Luther King, Jr., Day. The Department of Defense (DoD) joins the Nation in honoring King's life, achievements, and enduring impact on the United States.

Born in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1921, Reverend Doctor Martin Luther King, Jr., was a Baptist minister, champion of nonviolent protest to achieve change, and the face of the Civil Rights Movement, which led to legislation such as the Civil Rights Act and Voting Rights Act in the 1960s.

King National Day of Service



In 1994, Congress passed the King Holiday and Service Act, which designated the Martin Luther King, Jr., Federal holiday as a national Day of Service.

AmeriCorps has been spearheading efforts to mobilize citizens to actively engage in their communities.

60th Anniversary

This year marks the 60th anniversary of the Selma to Montgomery march campaign, led by Dr. King and the Southern Christian Leadership Council (SCLC), to stop voter suppression.

After the Civil War and the dismantling of slavery, Jim Crow laws facilitated the suppression of African American rights, including the right to vote. Due to voter registration restrictions and the threat of violence, Black voter participation in some Alabama counties was as low as 0%.



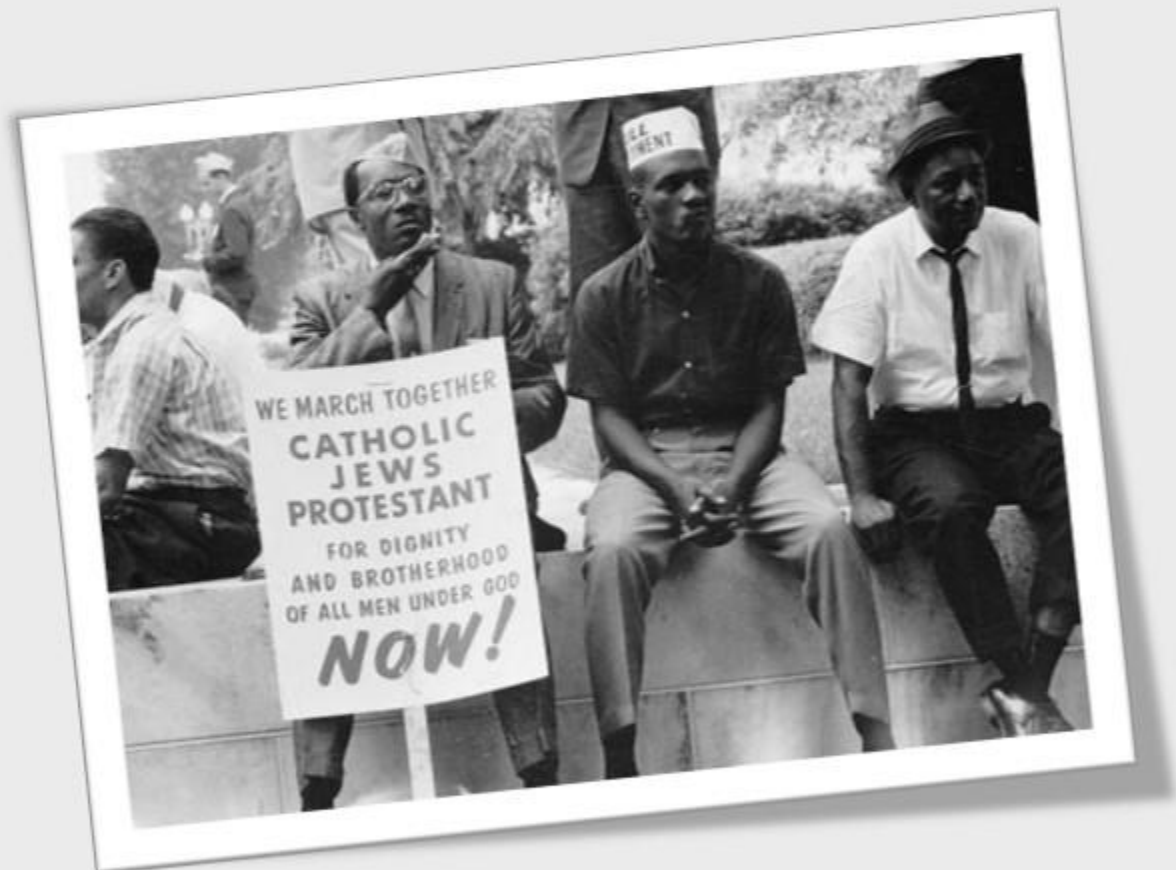
Excellence in Action

The 2025 DoD theme, “*Excellence in Action*,” highlights Dr. King’s nonviolent and effective approach to address the atrocities that occurred during that antagonistic and fateful period.

In the face of violence and prejudice, Dr. King and other civil rights activists peacefully protested, conducted boycotts, informed the uninitiated, and launched marches like those from Selma to Montgomery.



Selma to Montgomery Marches (1 of 3)



Civil rights protestors during the march from Selma to Montgomery, Alabama, 1965.

In 1965, Dr. King and the SCLC launched a protest and voter registration campaign in Selma.

On March 7, around 600 nonviolent protestors began marching the 54 miles from Selma to Montgomery. When they reached the Edmund Pettus Bridge, they were attacked by law enforcement, forcing them to turn around. At least 50 protestors were hospitalized during the attack, which became known as "Bloody Sunday."

Selma to Montgomery Marches (2 of 3)

Following the attack, Dr. King called for another march. On March 9, the "Ministers' March" saw 2,000 protesters return to the same bridge. Dr. King led the group in prayer when they were once again confronted by state troopers. To avoid another violent confrontation, they peacefully returned to Selma.

Tragically, that day, three ministers in support of the march were attacked by White men; among them was Reverend James Reeb, who died from his injuries.

Selma to Montgomery Marches (3 of 3)

On March 21, the third and final march commenced under federal and state protection to prevent attacks. Over 8,000 protesters marched for five days until they arrived in Montgomery.

By March 25, the crowd had swelled to 25,000 people. Upon reaching the Alabama State Capitol building, Dr. King delivered his “Our God Is Marching On” speech, advocating for voting protections and denouncing segregation.

Martin Luther King, Jr., Quote

“I know you are asking today, 'How long will it take?' Somebody's asking, 'How long will prejudice blind the visions of men?’

I come to say to you this afternoon, however difficult the moment, however frustrating the hour, it will not be long, because truth crushed to earth will rise again.

How long? Not long, because no lie can live forever. How long? Not long, because you shall reap what you sow. How long? Not long.”

Voting Rights Act of 1965

Using his influence and nonviolent pressure for change, Dr. King faced violent resistance during these marches, leading to an outpouring of support from across the nation.

Five months after the marches, Congress and President Lyndon B. Johnson enacted the Voting Rights Act of 1965 into law. This act ensured African Americans the right to vote by specifically banning literacy tests and other discriminatory practices designed to restrict participation based on race.

Assassination of Martin Luther King



The passing of the Voting Rights Act of 1965 was one just of many monumental achievements in Dr. King's career as a civil rights activist, which was tragically cut short.

On April 4, 1968, at the age of 39, Dr. King was assassinated on the balcony of his motel in Memphis, Tennessee, while supporting a sanitation workers' strike.

Conclusion

Dr. King fought for civil rights and voting protections through nonviolence and community action. He and other leaders in the movement made real, lasting changes in the lives of all Americans with actions like the Selma to Montgomery marches.

On Martin Luther King, Jr., Day, the DoD's theme, "***Excellence in Action***," honors Dr. King's legacy, passion, and perseverance in the fight against racial inequalities.

Together, we have the power to make a difference. Let's ***Remember*** the past, ***Celebrate*** the progress, and ***Act*** to ensure a brighter, more equal future for everyone!
